



Stonebridge Hat by Jenn Wisbeck

Corrugated Ribbing and Colorwork in Contrasting Colors

Knit from the bottom up in the round with deep corrugated ribbing for the hem, this hat has a simple eight stitch repeats to form the pattern. The pattern will work best in solid and semi-solid yarns with some contrast.

Level

Intermediate- colorwork in the round, knit, purl, increase, decrease

Gauge

21 stitches and 18 rows per 4"/10 cm in in Chart A, blocked

Size

Medium (Large). Show in size Medium.

Finished Size: 19.5 (22.5) inches/ 49.5 (57) cm around; 9.5 inches/ 24 cm high

To Fit Size: 20.5 (23.5) inches/ 52 (59.5) cm

Yarn

MC (Grey): 95 (110) yards, 87 (100) meters

CC (Red): 80 (92) yards, 73 (84) meters

Sample knit in Cascade 220 Sport by Cascade Yarns (100% wool; 164 yards/150 meters per 1.75 ounces/50 gram skein) 1 skein in color 9404 (MC) and 8400 (CC).

Materials

-US #6/4 mm 16" circular and double pointed (dpns) needles, or size to get gauge

-Tapestry needle to weave in ends

-1 Stitch marker to mark start of round

Abbreviations

*, ** - Repeat from * to **

CC - Contrast Color

CO - Cast on

K - Knit

K2tog - Knit 2 stitches together

M1 - Make 1 - insert left needle in the strand between the stitches from the front to the back.

With right needle knit through the back loop

MC - Main color

Ssk - Slip next 2 sts knitwise, then knit these 2 sts together through the backs of the loops

St(s) - Stitch(es)

Notes

Charts are read from right to left and bottom to top.
